- Eligible applicants must submit applications to the Southeast Alabama Coalition for the Homeless FY2024 CoC funding no later than 3:00pm on Monday, September 16, 2024, to seach@dothanhousing.org for consideration of NEW Projects.
- Your agency DOES NOT HAVE TO HAVE BEEN PREVIOUSLY FUNDED IN THIS CONTINUUM to apply for funding.
- A successful proposal will not exceed 10 pages (not including budget worksheets) with 1-inch margins, 12-point font.
- The only projects the Continuum will accept are (in no particular order): • Rapid Rehousing (RRH) • Hybrid Housing RRH/ TH Programs • Permanent Supportive Housing • Supportive Services Only in the form of Coordinated Entry (to be discussed with Continuum prior to submission) • HMIS- HMIS Lead Only
- Applicants who submit prior to the submission deadline will receive targeted feedback and suggestions from the CoC team, followed by the opportunity to re-submit their application in advance of the final submission deadline.

Project Type Descriptions

Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) must be fully dedicated to serve individuals and/or families in which at least one adult or one child (only if no adults) has a disability and is experiencing chronic homelessness.

Rapid Rehousing (RRH) (*Tenant-Based Rental Assistance only*), may serve households including *individual adults, youth/young adults (18-24), or families with minor children* who qualify as homeless under paragraphs (1), (2), or (4) of 24 CFR 578.3.

Joint Transitional Housing-Rapid Rehousing (TH-RRH) may serve households including *individual adults, youth/young adults (18-24), or families with minor children* who qualify as homeless under paragraphs (1), (2), or (4) of 24 CFR 578.3.

SSO- Coordinated Entry operates under the authority of HUD 24 CFR 578.7(a)(8), which mandates the CE process be developed to ensure that all people experiencing a housing crisis have fair and equal access and are quickly identified, assessed for, referred, and connected to housing and assistance based on their individual strengths and needs.

HMIS is the system used to collect client-level data and data on the provision of housing and services to program participants. The HEARTH Act requires that all communities have an HMIS and collect information from their CoC and ESG-funded projects.
